Letter from the Executive Director

The Black Hawk County Gaming Association (BHCGA) has spent the last 15 years dedicated to "helping the Cedar Valley prosper." As we celebrated this exciting milestone in Fiscal Year 23 (FY23), the BHCGA Board spent a significant amount of time thinking about impact, both past and future.

Staff

Since our inception, the partnership between BHCGA and the Isle Casino Hotel Waterloo has reinvested over \$72 million in Northeast Iowa. Our focus has been the collaboration with cities and nonprofit organizations to build up sizeable public infrastructure with the goal of making the Cedar Valley a better place to live, work, and play.

FY23 was no exception. The Board approved funds for 39 different projects totaling \$2,256,064. As you'll read throughout the annual report, the grants selected are very diverse. From air pack replacements in Chickasaw County to Casey Lake restoration at Hickory Hills to a new Cedar Valley Kids location in Waterloo, our recipients represent the various sizes, locations, and populations served across our seven counties. Each grantee is doing great work to address community needs, and we're honored to be part of their exciting efforts to build a brighter future.

In January 2023, the BHCGA Board of Directors and staff prioritized time to analyze past funding and where the most significant impact could be in future grant cycles. As a result, board members voted to update the funding guidelines to be clearer and more concise for applicants. In addition, we started exploring how our organization can be a community leader outside of grantmaking.

As we look into the next fiscal year, the Board of Directors are eager to continue strategic planning surrounding community impact. The last 15 years serving Northeast Iowa have been truly remarkable, and we look forward to continued growth and service for years to come.

FY23 AWARD SPOTLIGHT

Cedar Valley Kids - \$300,000

Cedar Valley Kids North Crossing

Access to quality, affordable childcare is an issue across our state. To tackle the disproportionate shortage of daycare centers on Waterloo's north side, Cedar Valley Kids and UnityPoint Health/Allen Hospital joined forces to create a new location. A temporary site is underway at the Allen College Campus, with the permanent North Crossing site slotted to open in the spring of 2024. BHCGA Board is proud to partner with UnityPoint and Cedar Valley Kids on such an important project. Once complete, the Cedar Valley Kids North Crossing site will provide 116 childcare spaces for UnityPoint employees and residents of the north side of Waterloo.

Buchanan County Conservation - \$20,000

Lakeside-Prairie Campground

Fontana Park is one of Buchanan County's most popular parks and tourist destinations. With the \$20,000 award from the Board of Directors, the Buchanan County Conservation Board is Lakeside-Prairie modernizing the Campgrounds. It will be the first campground in the county with water, sewer, and electric hookups. When the project is complete, the campground will offer various water activities along the lake and trail systems, interpretative trails, live animal displays, and other fun and educational opportunities.

Janesville Public Library - \$75,000

Community Space

Inspired by author Caitlin Moran's quote, the City of Janesville recognized the need for more space in its library. With funds awarded from BHCGA, the Janesville Public Library will gain 1600 square feet of open space. Once finished, the library will be open to all and serve as a community hub with more resources and programs.

A library in the middle of a community is a cross between an emergency exit, a life raft, and a festival.

House of Hope - \$36,000

Pillars Porch Rebuild

The massive 125-year-old duplex on Walnut Street is as much a vital part of the historical Walnut neighborhood as it is the House of Hope's Pillars program. Used as transitional housing for women who've aged out of the foster system, the duplex was severely in need of a new porch. But replacing a historic porch is no small feat. With the money awarded from the BHCGA Board of Directors, the House of Hope can continue functioning as transitional housing while reconstruction is underway. Once complete, the porch will maintain the historic nature of the Walnut neighborhood.



City of Evansdale - \$34,000

Willow Run Dog Park

The Cities of Evansdale and Elk Run teamed up to establish Willow Run Dog Park, maximizing the green space between Bunger and Mayor's parks. The park, which is close to the trail system connecting both communities, is the ideal space for residents to safely let their dogs run free.











Boys and Girls Club of the Cedar Valley - \$100,000

Lime Street Elevator Project

For over 50 years, the Boys and Girls Club of the Cedar Valley has been an anchor in youth programs and mentorship opportunities. As inclusion becomes more important for the community youth, the Boys and Girls Club is working to make the main clubhouse located at 515 Lime Street more accessible for all. BHCGA supports this mission by funding the cost of an elevator unit so club members, parents, staff, volunteer groups, and community members can access the unique spaces on the second floor of the Lime Street location.







City of Jesup - \$50,000

Liberty Volunteer Park Splash Pad

Nothing screams summer like the sound of kids playing at a splashpad! BHCGA Board of Directors were pleased to partner with the City of Jesup on its Liberty Volunteer Park Splash Pad. When this multi-phase, 2,500 square foot splash pad is finished, it will be the only splash pad in Buchanan County and the first allinclusive, fully accessible park in the Jesup community.





Dysart Development Corporation - \$10,000

Main Street Pocket Park

When a large tree was removed from Dysart's Main Street, the Dysart Development Corporation transformed the empty space into a pocket park. The covered area with photos of historic Dysart now serves as a place to socialize, dine, or enjoy some local entertainment.

DISCRETIONARY AWARDS

The Discretionary Fund allows the Board of Directors to award grants outside our competitive application process. In most cases, interest income is used to fund these requests.

MLK New Jerusalem - \$7,000

Freedom Bus Tour 2022

The MLK Freedom Bus Tour allows participants to go on a week-long journey to visit historic human and civil rights monuments in the U.S. In FY23, the Board approved a last-minute emergency request to help send participants to several iconic spaces in Tennessee and Alabama, including the Lorraine Motel, the Edmund Pettus Bridge, the Brown Chapel AME Church, and Kelly Ingram Park. MLK New Jerusalem sponsored this incredible opportunity, and the BHCGA Board was proud to partner in the 2022 tour.




