What is BHCGA?

Different from other local funders

QSO – qualified sponsored organization

How does money come to BHCGA?



Contract with Isle Waterloo

5.75% of AGR from tables and slots Approx. \$4-5 million per year




Sports Wagering

Caesar's Sportsbook – 0.75% of payout Average \$3,000 per month


Our funding can be hard to predict!

How are funds distributed?

- 25% of AGR –Restricted to Downtown Waterloo (Waterloo Development Corp)
- As per our agreement with the Isle, remaining funds for the BHCGA competitive grants should be allocated as follows:
 - * 50% Local government in BHC
 - 40% Nonprofit organizations in BHC
 - 10% Benton, Bremer, Buchanan, Butler, Chickasaw, Grundy and Tama
- **REQUIRED** to allocate 3% AGR annually

BHCGA by the Numbers

- Average Grant Size: \$108,579
 - City in BHC: \$690,000
 - Nonprofit in BHC: \$432,000
 - Non-BHC: \$25,773
- Approval rate: 30%
- Historically, 85% of what we've funded has been capital projects.
- Average Grant Size for Non-Capital Projects: \$32,977

Grant Cycles for FY25





Capital Grants: Transforming Places and Spaces

The goal of these grants is to build better cities, neighborhoods, and places in Black Hawk County, Iowa.


- Request size will vary based on scope, impact, and community partners:
 - Individual org equipment/upgrades: \$40,000
 - Multi-million construction: \$250,000-\$500,000
 - Requests \$500,000+ should show connection to community needs and partnerships
- Most interested in public, inclusive spaces



Capacity Building Grants: Transforming Critical Community Services

The goal of these grants is to help organizations in Black Hawk County, Iowa, build stronger skills, processes, and resources to better serve the Cedar Valley.

- Helping reach the next level of operational, financial, or organizational maturity to better serve community needs.
- Requests in this category typically range from \$5,000 \$50,000.



How might capacity building transform critical community services?



Out of County Grants: Investing in Projects Benefiting the Region

These grants are intended for cities and nonprofit organizations in Benton, Bremer, Buchanan, Butler, Chickasaw, Grundy, and Tama counties.

- Requests in this category typically range from \$5,000 - \$50,000
- Most interested in capital improvements
- Must apply through local community foundation before BHCGA
- Staff approval more than \$50,000

Requests will NOT be considered:

💼 Endowment funds

Political causes, candidates, or lobbying efforts

Individuals, including scholarships, fellowships, or personal benefits

🛉 Religious workshops, education, or proselytizing


Solution Debt incurred or purchases made prior to award date

\$ Capital requests for more than 50% of the total project budget

Must be nonprofit or government agency – do not accept fiscal agents

in No funding to affiliates of the Iowa Racing and Gaming Commission

How does our board evaluate and prioritize grants?



Recommended to Strengthen Proposal

Demonstrate a community need

Letters of support and/or resolutions – especially if government agency

Multi-year and consecutive year requests are rare

Collaborative initiatives

Significant funding committed

Realistic timeline

If you submitting more than \$100,000, you MUST meet with staff

New applicants should meet with staff before LOI opens
